*** This informational letter (IL) provides an update to IL 2449-MC-FFS-CVD¹.***

In March 2020, the federal PHE established flexibilities to the Medicaid program in accordance with PHE policies and benefits. With the announcement that the PHE will end on May 11, 2023, lowa Medicaid is providing an update on the status of HCBS flexibilities for the state plan 1915(i) HCBS Habilitation program and the 1915(c) HCBS waivers. The HCBS Habilitation flexibilities which were extended after May 11, 2023, and the HCBS waiver flexibilities granted during the PHE that the Department has chosen not to continue will end November 11, 2023.

For those HCBS flexibilities that will continue, HHS has submitted the HCBS waiver amendments to the Centers for Medicaid and CHIP services (CMS) requesting to add those flexibilities to the waivers. CMS published State Medicaid Directors Letter <u>SMDL 23-004²</u> notifying states that CMS will allow any flexibilities that were granted through a 1915 Appendix K amendment to continue when the state has submitted the HCBS Waiver amendments to CMS prior to the November 11, 2023, expiration date for the 1915 Appendix K. This additional time will be needed by CMS to review and approve the HCBS waiver amendments submitted by states.

The following HCBS Waiver flexibilities will continue:

Flexibility Category	Specific Flexibility	Program(s)	Flexibility Extended	What Does This Mean?
Parents of Minors, Spouses and Family Members	Allow spouses, parents of minors and family members to provide direct services (HCBS waiver population for supported community living (SCL), consumer- directed attendant care (CDAC). This includes parents, spouses and family members hired by an agency and/or working under the Consumer Choices Option (CCO).	HCBS Waivers	Waiver amendments submitted to CMS	Spouses and parents of minors may continue to deliver SCL or CDAC services to their spouse or minor child in extraordinary circumstances as defined by the state. Any services which are activities that a legally responsible individual would ordinarily perform in the household on behalf of a person without a disability or chronic illness of the same age and are not necessary to assure the health and welfare of the member and to avoid institutionalization would not be considered extraordinary.

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Medical Day Care for Children	CMS approved this flexibility April 7, 2023, to replace Respite while the parents are working. Temporarily add this service under the Bl, ID, HD and CMHW. This service provides for the supervision and support of children residing in their family home who, because of their complex medical or complex behavioral needs, require specialized exceptional care that cannot be provided in traditional childcare settings. The service must be medically necessary and verified in writing by the child's healthcare provider and documented in the child's service plan.	HCBS Waiver – CMH, BI, HD and ID	Waiver amendment submitted to CMS	Children with complex medical or behavioral needs that require specialized exceptional care that cannot be provided in the traditional childcare or daycare setting may access this service while their primary caregiver is working, attending school or otherwise regularly absent.
Adult Day Care in the Home	CMS approved this flexibility April 7, 2023, to replace Respite while the primary caregiver is working outside the home and no other service exists to provide the support, supervision or protective oversight needed by the member. Temporarily add adult day care to provide protective oversight and supervision for individuals in the home because of the absence of the primary caregiver.	HCBS AIDS/HIV, BI, Elderly, HD and ID Waivers	Waiver amendments submitted to CMS	Adults requiring a degree of supervision and assistance on a regular or intermittent basis in the home because of the absence of the primary caregiver will have access to supports including protective oversight, supervision, activities of daily living (ADLs) and instrumental activities of daily living (IADLs).

Home Delivered Meals	Provide home delivered meals, subject to prior authorization, for Medicaid enrollees who are enrolled in a 1915(c) waiver and home delivered meals are not a covered benefit and are homebound because of the PHE.	HCBS Brain Injury (BI) Waiver, Intellectual Disability (ID) Waiver and Physical Disability (PD) Waiver	November 11, 2023	Home delivered meals will no longer be a covered benefit and BI, ID and PD waiver members should work with case managers or care coordinators to explore alternative sources for home delivered meals as needed.

For HCBS waivers, the following flexibilities will **end** November 11, 2023.

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Exceed Respite Service Limitations	Remove the annual cost limit for respite services on the ID waiver.	HCBS ID Waiver	November 11, 2023	The annual limit for ID Waiver Respite will apply. Members should begin working with case managers or care coordinators to return to pre-PHE respite service levels. The annual Respite limit will apply with dates of service beginning December I, 2023. Members will be able to access up to the annual limit for the next I2 consecutive months prorated based on the number of months remaining in the member's waiver service plan year.*

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Exceed Respite Service Limitations	Remove the limitation on respite provided for children while parents or primary caregivers are working from home to relieve pressure created by work, school and daycare closures during the PHE. Allow Case Management Entities to Provide Direct Services	The state is responding to the PHE personnel crisis by authorizing case management entities to provide direct services. The case management entity qualifies under 42 CFR 441.301(c)(1)(vi) as the only willing and qualified entity.	HCBS Waivers	November 11, 2023	Members should work with case managers to secure qualified direct service providers.

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HCBS Settings	 Allow HCBS to be provided in intermediate care facilities for individuals with intellectual disability (ICF/ID) or other facility setting through an exception to policy (ETP). Allow HCBS to be delivered in direct care provider's homes through an ETP. Allow the direct care provider to move into the member's homes. Lift the limitation on five person homes to allow more than five persons in accordance with the home's capacity. 	HCBS Waivers HCBS Habilitation	November 11, 2023	Providers should begin returning to pre-PHE policy and procedures in compliance with the HCBS settings rule. This includes no more than five individuals residing in a home that is not licensed.
Assistance with eLearning	Allow for supported community living (SCL) and HBH to provide for support with eLearning for members aged 17-21 living outside the family home when school occurs virtually.	HCBS Waivers HCBS Habilitation	November 11, 2023	Pre-PHE policy and procedures resume.

Processes occur face-to-face unless virtual/telehealth processes are specifically requested by the member because of documented health concerns with annual documentation from a physician.
Processes	Allow electronic signing off on required documents such as the person-centered service plan. 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Processes	 Allow an extension for reassessments and reevaluations for up to one year past the due date. Option to conduct evaluations, assessments, and person-centered planning (PCP) remotely in lieu of face-to-face. Adjust assessment requirements. 	HCBS Waivers HCBS Habilitation	November II, 2023	Pre-PHE operating procedures resume: • Annual reassessments must occur every 12 months. PCP occurs face- to-face in a location of member's choosing.
Provider Recertification Process Requirements	lowa Medicaid will extend the certification process due to resource capacity issues directly related to the PHE in 90-day increments through the established exception to policy (ETP) process. Iowa Medicaid will only extend certification for providers who are in good standing, do not have outstanding corrective action plans (CAPS) and/or CAPS that have not been met, and who are not under active investigation for reported noncompliance with HCBS quality standards. 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Electronic Method of Service Delivery	Electronic method of service delivery (e.g., telephonic) allowing services to continue being provided remotely in the home setting for the following services: • Case management • In-home habilitation • monthly monitoring • eligibility evaluations/ reevaluations • Independent assessments/ reassessments of need • Completion of person-centered service planning meetings Additionally, the state will allow telehealth services to be provided for home-based habilitation, day habilitation and supported employment, regardless of the recipient's location, if provision of the service via telehealth is clinically feasible and appropriate. *HCBS Waiver Consumer Choices Option (CCO) participants

Due to the nature of the budgeting process, CCO members will transition mid-month to Pre-PHE service amounts and policies. Case managers should be working with the member and their team to make changes to the service plan and budget that will be implemented November 1, 2023.
