1. Basic Overview

Rebecca initially became a non-registered childcare provider in 1996. She became registered in 2003. She previously participated in the quality rating system and was rated at a level one. She is also a participant of the current IQ4K quality rating system and is rated at a level one. She does participate in the food program. Rebecca is willing to care for children from the ages of infant throughout age 5. Rebecca provides care primarily on the lower level of her home. She does have one bedroom on the main level that she might use for a child to nap. Aside from that, she has her lower level set up with a kitchen and bathroom and nap areas, and a nice place space for the children. Rebecca has a large yard for outdoor play space and has various climbing toys for outside play. The yard was well maintained. Rebecca does have one dog that typically does not interact with the childcare children. Rebecca does not have an approved substitute or assistant.

2. Identify Observed Strengths Of The Program

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Rebecca had seven children in care when this worker arrived. The children were actively involved in Free Play. Rebecca has a nice childcare space for the children. She has activities and toys for small muscle development and large muscle development. She also described some routine in her day. This worker observed the children in Free Play as well as time for them to sit and look at some books.

This worker observed Rebecca appropriately interact with the children while I was present and I observed her to appropriately redirect the children as needed.

Rebecca's policies were nicely written and detailed and included much more than the required minimum policies. Rebecca had a couple of binders for all of the required documentation for the children's files and for her provider paperwork as well. Her documentation was nicely organized so this worker was able to review her documentation while she was able to continue to care for the children.

This worker did observe a baby sleeping in a pack and play and I was able to observe her abiding by safe sleep policies.

Rebecca was in full compliance with all mandated regulatory requirements of a Registered Child Development Home.

A re-check is not needed at this time as she was in full compliance.

Rebecca shared that she does not transport the childcare children.

Rebecca shared that she does not ever use a swimming pool but will use a sprinkler or water table for other water play.

We did discuss safe sleep policies.

We did discuss the number of children she is allowed to care for at one time as a Category B provider.

As part of the 2026 Targeted compliance the Emergency Preparedness Plan was thoroughly reviewed. Rebecca was in compliance with her EPP.

She was encouraged to review it at least yearly to ensure that no changes need to be made.

Recommendations:

As of 7/1/25 providers are expected to have something in writing to notify parents that the state does allow parents to submit an exemption for immunizations (either religious or medical) in lieu of the immunization record for each child. Rebecca did already have something in writing to this effect.
