1. Basic Overview

Peggy shared that she has been caring for her grandson for about 3 years. She is now getting approved as a Registered childcare provider. She is not a participant of the IQ4K quality rating system. She is not yet a participant of the Food Program although we did discuss that program today. If she is interested in that, she agreed to obtain more information accordingly. Peggy is getting Registered with the plan to only care for her grandchildren. She currently cares for her 6-year old grandson and talked of taking an infant grandchild in the future. She does not plan to provide childcare to the general public. Peggy does have a small dog. Peggy does not have an approved assistant or substitute. Peggy plans to utilize her main level of her home only for childcare. She does have a large yard that is mostly fenced off.

2. Identify Observed Strengths Of The Program



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Today's visit was a Pre-inspection to get her approved to be a Registered childcare provider. She is currently caring for her 6-year-old grandson who was not present on this date, so this worker was not able to observe interactions.

Peggy is not required to have an illness policy or health related emergency policy at the time of the Pre-inspection, but she did already have those. Children's files do not need to be reviewed at the time of the Pre-inspection, but this worker did discuss what is needed and Peggy did already have the appropriate forms and documentation for her grandson. CCR&R has provided her a binder for documentation, and she was encouraged to continue to use that to keep her documentation organized.

Peggy is just getting started but presented as open to utilizing the CCR&R support that is available to her. She did ask appropriate questions on this date.

3. Identify The Aspects That Fall Below The Standard

110.8 (3) a : All medicines and poisonous, toxic, or otherwise unsafe materials are secured from access by a child.

Peggy did not have chemicals/cleaners under her kitchen sink that were secured with a rubber band.

*Peggy needs to obtain an appropriate latch for the cabinet under her kitchen sink, so chemicals and cleaners are appropriately secured from access by a child.

Peggy will need to send pictorial verification of compliance to this worker before the PI can be approved.

Peggy did send pictorial verification on 1/16/26.

A re-check is not needed at this time.

Peggy did submit the appropriate verification to this worker on 1/16/26 so as of this date she is in Full compliance with the items required for a Pre-inspection.

Notes:

Peggy shared that she will plan to transport children but as noted above she only plans to provide care to her grandchildren.

Peggy shared that she does not plan to use a swimming pool but might use a sprinkler or hose for other water play.

We did discuss safe sleep policies.

We did discuss the number of children she allowed to care for at one time as a Category A provider.

As part of the 2026 Targeted compliance the Emergency Preparedness Plan was thoroughly reviewed. She is required to have this at a Pre-inspection. Peggy did have a few items that needed to be corrected but those changes were made while this worker was present. At this time, she is in compliance with her EPP.

She was encouraged to review it at least yearly to ensure that no changes need to be made.

Recommendations:

Peggy did have written policies for ill children and health emergencies. These are not required at the PI but she did have them.

She did not yet have anything written in regard to notifying parents in writing that they are able to submit an exemption for immunizations (either religious or medical) in lieu of the immunization record for each child. This is a new policy effective 7/1/25 so we did discuss this, and she agreed to get that documented accordingly. The CCR&R support worker was also present at this PI and agreed to meet with Peggy again to work with her about that documentation.
