1. Basic Overview

I conducted a compliance visit with Registered Child Development Home Category B provider Jennifer Jacobs on 6/15/2026. Jennifer has been involved with child care for 21 years. She continues using her main floor only in their ranch style home. Jennifer's home is at the edge of town. Jennifer does not have any HHS-approved assistants or substitutes. Jennifer uses her open rural yard space for an outside play area. She is due to renew her registration effective 10/31/2026.

2. Identify Observed Strengths Of The Program

Jennifer has 21 years of experience in child care. She serves in an area of the State short of Registered Child Development Homes and is trying to help her community by taking several part time children during the summer. She considers herself



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organized, though had accepted too many of the part time children during the day of our visit. She also describes patience as one of her key strengths. Jennifer's summer curriculum includes a great amount of outside time and free play. She has sand boxes, games, outside toys, and lots of open space for the children. Her curriculum also includes traditional activities such as coloring, crafts, and puppets.

3. Identify The Aspects That Fall Below The Standard

110.8 (1) e : An annual laboratory analysis shows satisfactory bacteriological quality if a private water supply is used. Nitrate analysis when children under 2.

If water is determined unsuitable for drinking, commercially bottled water or water treated and approved by the health department is provided.

- Jennifer needs to obtain a new well water statement to have on file. She needs to email me a copy of the new statement by 8/31/2026 or will need to change to only commercial water for the child care until she can get the statement.

- During the day of my visit, Jennifer had accepted several of her part time children outside their normally scheduled hours. She was over the maximum for a Category B provider by one child. She was over the limit of 8 children for more than 2 hours at a time having no HHS-approved assistants. Jennifer was in compliance with her infant and age ratios. Five of the children were leaving within an hour of my visit which would bring her back to 8 children. Jennifer must add a HHS-approved assistant if she plans to have more than 8 children present for more than 2 hours. Jennifer must remain within allowable numbers at all times. Jennifer's control of her environment was stressed with the high numbers of children present.

The 2026 targeted compliance for the Emergency Preparedness Plan was conducted. Jennifer was in compliance having a plan consistent with her current operation.
