Summary of Complaint:			
Concerns were reported regarding the amount of children Sarah was caring for. Additionally, it was reported that the house was not clean and smelled of animal urine and feces.			

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Rule Basis and Findings of Complaint(s):**110.15(l)(a)**

When both providers are present, not more than 14 preschool children are present at any one time, including infants.

110.8

Conditions in the home shall be safe, sanitary, and free from hazards.

SWS Aunspach and SW Jaehrling made an unannounced visit on 4/9/25. Upon arrival, SWS Aunspach explained the nature of the visit. SW Jaehrling and Sarah went through which children were present. It was identified at that time she was 2 over her capacity. Sara reported that her assistant would take two of her own children and leave. Sarah reported she believed that she had 30 days to come into compliance from the last visit by SW Jaehrling. We discussed that she needed to come into compliance with numbers immediately and moving forward. Sarah reported she understood. It is determined that Sarah is was out of compliance with rule 110.15(l)(a) .

When a child opened the door to greet us, a smell was noticeable. While touring the home, there were 4 dogs and 4 cats in the home. Sarah reported that they were getting rid of 2 cats this weekend and 2 of the dogs were the assistants. SWS Aunspach expressed concern with the lack of space and the amount of animals. There was a litter box observed on the landing of their staircase to be full and have a pungent urine and feces smell coming from it. There was not any feces or urine noted on the floors. There weren't any concerns regarding the cleanliness of the downstairs area used for child care. SW Jaehrling did report improvement from past visits with the cleanliness of the house and the smell, however; there was room for further improvement. There was a discussion around the health concerns for children breathing cat urine and feces smell which include respiratory issues, allergic reactions and infections. Sarah reported she understood and would make sure to do a deep clean, she was going to get new cat boxes with liners and change the litter more frequently. In a subsequent phone call, Sarah reported that she told the assistant that she could no longer bring her two dogs with her to the Child Development Home when she is working. Sarah reports being motivated to improve the conditions and follow expectations. It was determined that Sarah was out of compliance with rule 110.8.

Resolution and Action Required:

A safety plan was signed by Sara and Dillion (co-provider) agreeing to immediately follow the ratio for a C2 provider and to clean the house and litter boxes and to stay on top of the litter to minimize animal smells.

No further action required at this time.
