I conducted a compliance visit with Registered Child Development Home Category B provider Mary Huisman on 1/5/2026. Mary has been involved in child care for 40 years. She continues providing care using the main floor only of her slab, ranch style home. Mary has a large, fenced-in back yard and a public park across the street that she uses as an outside play area. Mary had 8 children in care at the time of my visit. This included her entire group currently in care. Mary has no HHS-approved assistants or substitutes. She has one pet dog, who had a current vet statement on file. Mary's current registration runs through 7/31/2026.

2. Identify Observed Strengths Of The Program

Mary maintains a very neat and clean home environment. She has a one level, open floor design and has some gates that can be used to separate play areas. Mary offers limited screen time to the children. She describes her curriculum as a modified pre-school program which includes games, story time, learning activities, and music time. The children have regular outside time as weather permits. Mary describes her strengths as patience and organization. She is on the Food Program to enhance the nutrition of her meals and snacks.
