CHILD CARE ANNUAL EVALUATION

1. Basic Overview

I conducted a compliance visit with Registered Child Development Home Category B provider Angela Robinson on 7/8/2025. Angela is currently certified for a period from 6/1/2025 - 5/31/2027. She has one Department approved assistant, and no current substitutes on her registration. Angela's operation is located in a ranch style home on the edge of small town. Her water and sewer are part of the town's public utilities and no well or septic are used. The home has all electric appliances including water heater and baseboard heat. Angela uses her main floor space during transition times only. Most of her inside time with the children takes place in the basement level. The basement has 2 low egress windows with easy 2-step stair access to base of window. Angela reports having been involved in child care for 22 years. Angela had 6 children in care during the time of my visit.

2. Identify Observed Strengths Of The Program

Angela is an experienced child care provider. She was within her allowable numbers of children for a Category B provider during the time of my visit and admitted she does not regularly need her assistant. Angela showed me a detailed tracking attendance sheet she uses to stay within her allowable numbers of under school-age children. Several of them are teacher's kids or part-time, making the summer easier to manage. Angela had one infant under 12 months of age who was awake during my visit. She had adequate pack-n-plays to accommodate safe infant sleeping. Angela displayed good attention to the children and multitasking while I was at the home. Her environment is arranged for pretty good observation of children, taking advantage of a kitchen set-up downstairs for meal preparation. Angela just renewed her registration, all of her trainings were verified by the Registration Unit.
