II. IDENTIFY THE AREAS OBSERVED ON THE VISIT:

This worker arrived at CAMPUS FOR KIDS DAYCARE – 19821 on 6/27/24 and 8/29/24 for an annual visit. The fire inspection was completed on 4/27/23. The center is for nonprofit and overseen by a board of directors. The center serves infants-preschool aged children. The center is open year around. The hours of operation are 6:00am-6:00pm. Their current enrollment is 31 ,

The director is Donna Sorensen. Donna has her Child Development Associate's. She started in 2015.

This worker observed all programming space in the center and outdoor area to ensure that the environment was safe, sanitary and hazard free. The center is in a commercial building. The center has 5 classrooms, kitchen, office and storage space.

Health and safety practices were also reviewed including handwashing, medication management, appropriate cleaning/sanitizing/disinfecting, excluding ill children/staff, incident reports, and first aid kits.

Nutritional practices and food safety were observed. The center is on the Child and Adult Care Food Program. The center offers breakfast, lunch and afternoon snack.

This worker reviewed required postings. This worker checked staff files and child files. The licensing notebook including emergency drills, first aid supplies, playground checklist, radon testing, HVAC testing and policies were reviewed. The center does communicate with parents via phone calls, emails, written daily sheets, etc.

The center's curriculum is teacher created.

The center does offer walking field trips to the park.

III. IDENTIFY THE OBSERVED STRENGTHS OF THE CENTER:

- The center is on Child and Adult Care Food Program.
- The center accepts Child Care Assistance.
- The center is clean and nicely decorated.

IV. IDENTIFY THE ASPECTS OF OPERATION THAT FALL BELOW THE STANDARDS REVIEWED:
