II. IDENTIFY THE AREAS OBSERVED ON THE VISIT:

Grinnell College Preschool is a preschool program that has a dual purpose. The preschool is located in a single standing building that has a secured entrance. It provides a quality, early childhood program for children ages three through five. The preschool is also affiliated with the Grinnell College Psychology Department. The center serves as a lab setting for Grinnell College students studying psychology. Karen Veerhusen-Langerud has been the director and lead teacher since 1997. She has a Bachelors degree in Early Childhood Education and a Masters degree in Special Education. Connie Molison has been a teacher at the preschool since 1995. College students volunteer during every session.

An unannounced visit was completed on today's date. All areas subject to DHS licensing were reviewed. Mandatory postings are in place in the preschool's lobby area. Lesson plans and schedules are also in place. The preschool has one classroom. There is also another room that is used for large motor play activities. The spacious classroom has many play and learning activity centers: art/painting, legos/lego table, dramatic play, reading, library, blocks, science, puzzles, light tables, computer, math, manipulative toys, music.

Connie was present today and assisted with the visit. Fourteen children were in attendance today. Two staff and two volunteers were working with this class during the visit. Children were observed doing child directed activities and large group time. Staff were actively engaged with the children throughout the visit. Staff supported and assisted the children as needed. Interactions between the staff and children were positive.

The center's playground has fencing. There is one large climbing structure. There is pea gravel for surfacing material. There is concrete for riding toys. The center has complete monthly playground checks.

Snacks are served during preschool sessions. Menus reflect CACFP requirements are followed.

III. IDENTIFY THE OBSERVED STRENGTHS OF THE CENTER:

The center participates in QRS and has earned a four star rating. Connie has been the director/lead teacher for many years. Additionally, Connie has been the assistant teacher for many years. The preschool benefits from their experience and leaderships. This preschool is unique and children benefit from the additional support and instruction from the college students. The spacious classroom is well supplied with diverse, well developed interest centers.
