441 IAC 110.7

This letter is in regards to the compliance visit at your Registered Child Development Home B conducted on 09/07/2018. lowa Code Chapter 237A and 441 lowa Administrative Code, Chapter 110, describes specific requirements that must be met by a Registered Child Development Home. You are not a participant in the voluntary Quality Rating and Improvement System. The following areas were out of compliance at the time of the visit:

441 17(0 11017	- To Vide Troqui emente
441 IAC 110.8	Standards. Conditions in the home are safe, sanitary, and free of hazards.
441 IAC 110.8(1)	Facility Requirements
441 IAC 110.8(1)" a"	The home shall have a nonpay, working land-line or mobile telephone with emergency numbers posted for police, fire, ambulance, and the poison information center. The number for each child's parent, for a responsible person who can be reached when the parent cannot, and for the child's physician shall be written on paper and readily accessible by the telephone. The home must prominently display all emergency information, and all travel vehicles must have a paper copy of emergency parent contact information
441 IAC 110.8(1)" h"	The home shall have at least one single-station, battery-operated, UL-approved smoke detector in each child-occupied room and at the top of every stairway. Each smoke detector shall be installed according to manufacturer's recommendations. The provider shall test each smoke detector monthly and keep a record of testing for inspection purposes
441 IAC 110.8(2)	Use of Outdoor Space

drainage or ponding of sewage, household waste, or storm water.

Medications and Hazardous Materials

441 IAC 110.8(3)"a" All medicines and poisonous, toxic, or otherwise unsafe materials shall be secured from access by a child

441 IAC 110.8(4) Emergency Plans

A safe outdoor play area shall be maintained in good condition throughout the year. The play area shall be fenced off when located on a busy thoroughfare or near a hazard which may be injurious to a child, and shall have both sunshine and shade areas. The play area shall be kept free from litter, rubbish, and flammable materials and shall be free from contamination by

441 IAC 110.8(4)

Emergency Plans: plans in case of man-made or natural disaster shall be written and posted by the primary and secondary exits. The plans shall clearly map building evacuation routes and tornado and flood shelter areas.

441 IAC 110.8(4) "a"

Fire and tornado drills shall be practiced monthly and the provider shall keep documentation evidencing compliance with monthly practice on file for the current year and the previous year.

441 IAC 110.8(5)

Safe Sleep

441 IAC 110.8(8)

Activity Program. There is an activity program and it promotes self-esteem and exploration.

- a. Activity program includes active play.
- **b.** Activity program includes quiet play.
- **c.** Activity program includes activities for large muscle development, such as running, climbing and riding toys.
- **d.** Activity program includes activities for small muscle development, such as coloring, puzzles, finger plays and play dough.
- **e.** Play equipment and materials in a safe condition, for both indoor and outdoor activities which are developmentally appropriate for the ages and number of children present.

A provider file is maintained and shall contain the following:

An individual file is maintained for each staff assistant and contains:

- Documentation from the department confirming the record checks required under subrule 110.11(3) have been completed and authorizing or conditionally limiting the person's involvement with child care
- 2. A completed Form 470-5152, Child Care Provider Physical Examination Report. The examination shall include any necessary testing for communicable diseases; a discussion of recommended vaccinations; completed no more than six months prior to approval to assist or be a household member; completed by a licensed medical doctor, doctor of osteopathy, physician assistant or advanced registered nurse practitioner; and repeated at least every three years.
- 3. Certification of two hours of approved training related to identification and reporting of child abuse as required by Iowa Code section 232.69 within 3 months of employment.

441 IAC 110.9(3)

An individual file is maintained for each substitute and contains:

- 1. Documentation from the department confirming the record checks required under 441 IAC 110.9(1) "a" have been completed and authorizing or conditionally limiting the person's involvement with child care.
- 2. A completed Form 470-5152, Child Care Provider Physical Examination Report. The examination shall include any necessary testing for communicable diseases; a discussion of recommended vaccinations; completed no more than six months prior to approval to assist or be a household member; completed by a licensed medical doctor, doctor of osteopathy, physician assistant or advanced registered nurse practitioner; and repeated at least every three years.
- 3. Certification of two hours of approved training related to identification and reporting of child abuse as required by Iowa Code section 232.69 within 3 months of employment.
- 4. Certification in infant and child first aid
- 5. Certification or other documentation that minimum health and safety training has been completed within 3 months or prior to providing substitute care, whichever occurs first.

441 IAC 110.9(4)

Children's Files. An individual file for each child shall be maintained and updated annually or when the provider becomes aware of changes. The file shall contain:

- **a.** Identifying information including, at a minimum, the child's name, birth date, parent's name, address, telephone number, special needs of the child, and the parent's work address and telephone number.
- **b.** Emergency information including, at a minimum, where the parent can be reached, the name, street address, city and telephone number of the child's regular source of health care, and the name, telephone number, and relationship to the child of another adult available in case of emergency.
- c. A signed medical consent from the parent authorizing emergency treatment.
- **d.** An admission physical examination report signed by a licensed physician or designee in a clinic supervised by a licensed physician
 - **1.** The date of the physical examination shall not be more than 12 months before the child's first day of attendance at the child development home.
 - **2.** The written report shall include past health history, status of present health, allergies and restrictive conditions, and recommendations for continued care when necessary.
 - **3.** For a child who is five years of age or older and enrolled in school, a statement of health status signed by the parent or legal guardian may be substituted for the physical examination report.
 - **4.** The examination report or statement of health status shall be on file before the child's first day of care
- **e.** For children under the age of 6,a statement of health condition signed by a physician or designee submitted annually from the date of the admission physical. For a child who is enrolled in school, a statement of health status signed by the parent or legal guardian may be substituted for the physician statement.
- **f.** For each school-age child, on the first day of attendance, documentation of a physical examination that was completed at the time of school enrollment or since.
- **g.** A signed and dated immunization certificate provided by the state department of public health. For the school-age child, a copy of the most recent immunization record shall be acceptable.
- **h.** For any child with allergies, a written emergency plan in the case of an allergic reaction. A copy of this information shall accompany the child if the child leaves the premises.
- i. Documentation that is signed by the parent and names persons authorized to pick up the child. The authorization shall include the name, telephone number, and relationship of the authorized person to the child.
- j. Written permission from the parent for the child to attend activities away from the child development home.k. Injury report forms documenting injuries requiring first aid or medical care
- **I.** If the child meets the definition of homelessness as defined by section 725(2) of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Education Assistance Act, the family shall receive a 60-day grace period to obtain medical documentation.

Findings:

Jennifer needs to remove paint, scrapers, deoderizer spray and lighters from bathroom area.

Jennifer needs to remove soiled diapers from her diaper changing table.

Jennifer needs to replace her screen on her bathroom window.

Jennifer needs to unplug her hair dryer in the bathroom area.

Jennifer needs to shut off Scentsy during daycare hours in her living room and bathroom.

Jennifer needs to update her emergency contact sheet for her daycare children.

Jennifer needs to update her documentation for her monthly smoke detector checks. Data is missing from May to

August of 2018.

Jennifer needs to remove Pack-N-Play and infant chair from her outdoor play area and discontinue their use; tape cracked plastic on her Little Tikes playset; re-assemble her basketball hoop; remove mower and gas from area; cover grill or remove from outdoor play area; remove wasp and hornet spray, lighter fluid; empty ashtray, and anchor her swingset.

Jennifer needs to post her emergency plans for fire and tornado next to her front door.

Jennifer needs to update her documentation for her monthly fire and tornado drills completed. Data is missing for May through August 2018.

441 IAC 110.9(4) Children's Files. An individual file for each child shall be maintained and updated annually or when the provider becomes aware of changes. The file shall contain:

Identifying information including, at a minimum, the child's name, birth date, parent's name, address, telephone number, special needs of the child, and the parent's work address and telephone number. Need for A.R.(8), A.R.(3), H.S. Need update for D.G.

Emergency information including, at a minimum, where the parent can be reached, the name, street address, city and telephone number of the child's regular source of health care, and the name, telephone number, and relationship to the child of another adult available in case of emergency. Need for A.R.(8), A.R.(3), H.S. Need update for D.G.

A signed medical consent from the parent authorizing emergency treatment. Need for A.R.(8), A.R.(3), H.S. Need update for D.G.

An admission physical examination report signed by a licensed physician or designee in a clinic supervised by a licensed physician

The date of the physical examination shall not be more than 12 months before the child's first day of attendance at the child development home.

The written report shall include past health history, status of present health, allergies and restrictive conditions, and recommendations for continued care when necessary. Need physical for A.R.(3), W.L., R.K.

For a child who is five years of age or older and enrolled in school, a statement of health status signed by the parent or legal guardian may be substituted for the physical examination report. Need for A.R.(8), L.E., H.S.

For each school-age child, on the first day of attendance, documentation of a physical examination that was completed at the time of school enrollment or since. Need enrollment physical for A.R.(8), L.E., H.S.

A signed and dated immunization certificate provided by the state department of public health. For the school-age child, a copy of the most recent immunization record shall be acceptable. Need for A.R.(8), A.R.(3), H.S.

A list that is signed by the parent and names persons authorized to pick up the child. The authorization shall include the name, telephone number, and relationship of the authorized person to the child. Need for A.R.(8), A.R.(3), H.S. Need update for D.G.

Written permission from the parent for the child to attend activities away from the child development home. Need for A.R.(8), A.R.(3), L.E. Need update for D.G.
