II. IDENTIFY THE AREAS OBSERVED ON THE VISIT:

This worker arrived at WEST BRANCH COMMUNITY EARLY LEARNING CENTER - 19820 for an annual visit on 1/29/2025. The fire inspection was completed on 6/20/2023. The center is non-profit and overseen by a board of directors. The center is in a commercial building. The center has six classrooms, a kitchen, small kitchenette, storage areas and an office. The center is open year around. The hours of operation are 7:00am to 6:00pm. The center provides care for infants to preschool aged children. The center’s current enrollment is 65.

The director is Lisa Moore. She started in 1/2023. She has an associate degree in early childhood education.

The onsite supervisor is Joanna Carter. She started in 4/2022. She has a master’s degree in public affairs.

This worker observed all programming space in the center and outdoor area to ensure that the environment was safe, sanitary and hazard free.

This worker observed infants being fed, infants being rocked, toddlers/teachers playing with a wide variety of toys, preschool age children eating lunch and preparing for naps.

Health and safety practices were also reviewed including handwashing, medication management, appropriate cleaning/sanitizing/disinfecting, excluding ill children/staff, incident reports, and first aid kits.

Nutritional practices were checked. The center is on CACFP through the school district. The center provides morning snack, lunch, and afternoon snack. The kitchen was maintained in a clean/orderly fashion.

This worker reviewed required postings. This worker checked staff files and child files. The licensing notebook including emergency drills, first aid supplies, playground, checklist, radon testing, HVAC testing and policies were reviewed.

The center does communicate with parents via: ProCare. The center’s curriculum is teacher created utilizing Creative Curriculum. The center does offer walking field trips.

III. IDENTIFY THE OBSERVED STRENGTHS OF THE CENTER:

- The center accepts Child Care Assistance.
- The center is on the Child and Adult Care Food Program.
- The center was in full compliance on the date of my visit.
- The center hired a cleaning crew to help maintain the building.
- The center is able to hire quality employees since they are able to offer insurance and retirement.

IV. IDENTIFY THE ASPECTS OF OPERATION THAT FALL BELOW THE STANDARDS REVIEWED:

109.11(3)a: Center shall ensure that: Facility and premises are sanitary, safe, and hazard free.

-Ensure that medication samples are stored inaccessible to the children.

109.12(2)d: No child is subject to verbal abuse, threats, derogatory remarks about child or child's family.

Based upon this review, it is recommended that this center remain in Full licensing status.
