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Summary of Complaint:

On March 11, 2025 the Department of Health and Human Services received a complaint regarding category B child development home provider, Teresa Sluwar. The complaint alleges Ms. Sluwar had a 2 year old get out of her child development home and was found across the street at an elementary school.

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Rule Basis and Findings of Complaint(s):

RULE(S):

441 IAC 110.14 SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS FOR CHILD DEVELOPMENT HOME CATEGORY "B"

441 IAC 110.14(1) "a" No more than eight children not attending kindergarten or a higher grade level shall be present at any one time

441 IAC 110.14(1)"b" Of these eight children, not more than four children who are 24 months of age or younger shall be present at any one time. Of these four children, no more than three may be 12 months of age or younger.

441 IAC 110.14(1)"c" In addition to the eight children not in school, no more than four children who attend school may be present

441 IAC 110.14(1)"d" No more than 12 children shall be present at any one time when an emergency school closing is in effect.

441 IAC 110.14(1)"e" If more than eight children are present at any one time for a period of more than two hours, the provider shall be assisted by a department-approved assistant who is at least 14 years old, unless extra children are present as a result of an emergency school closing

441 IAC 110.7(1) The provider shall meets the following requirements:

a. Gives careful supervision at all times.

FINDING(S):

On March 11, 2025 this worker and an additional social worker completed an unannounced visit to Ms. Sluwar's child development home. Ms. Sluwar was home and allowed entrance. Ms. Sluwar was watching 11 children ages 4 months to 5 years old. Ms. Sluwar was over numbers for a category B provider. Ms. Sluwar can provide care for 8 children as category B provider without an assistant. This worker also observed an infant sleeping in an pack and play with a thick blanket covering the mattress instead of a fitted sheet. This worker had Ms. Sluwar remove the blanket and reviewed safe sleep regulations. A safety plan was also signed regarding safe sleep. The complaint alleges a daycare child was able to get out of Ms. Sluwar's house on 3/10/2025 while in her care and was found at the school across the street by teachers. Ms. Sluwar was inside the home when this occurred. Ms. Sluwar had the screen door open to the backyard where there had been a small hole in the screen. The daycare child made the hole larger, was able to leave the home and backyard through a broken gate and then cross the street. The daycare child was able to do so in a very short amount of time. The daycare child was out of the home for a short period of time. Teresa did not know the incident had occurred.

Resolution and Action Required:

Ms. Sluwar has fixed the screen door as well as the backyard gate to prevent any further incident where a child could leave her leave her home without supervision.

A full compliance visit was completed at this time. Safe sleep regulations will be complied with at all times. Other minor corrective actions were necessary at that time, unrelated to the current complaint. This report concludes the evaluation of this complaint, no further action is required at this time.
