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1. Basic Overview

Christina Johnson has provided childcare since 2018. Before opening her childcare program, she spent many years working with older adults as a med aide and CNA. At the time of the visit, she had one assistant, Bailie, who helps during the summer and on days when school is closed. The provider explained that the number of children in care changes throughout the summer because family schedules vary. Six children were present during the visit, and two additional children were expected but were attending summer school. Children were playing in different parts of the main floor, which is set up in an L-shaped layout. Christina and Bailie were positioned in separate areas of the room so they could see all children at all times. The space included many toys, and children moved freely between activities. Christina described her program as child-led, meaning children choose what they want to play with. She offers drawing and coloring materials, and the children enjoy going outside or walking to the park. She also recently bought squirt guns so the children can run and play to release energy.

2. Identify Observed Strengths Of The Program

Compliance staff saw that the provider and her assistant were engaged with the children. The children approached them easily when they needed help. Both adults paid close attention to what the children were doing. Staff observed the provider using redirection when problems came up. She suggested new activities or a different area when a child needed a change.

The provider stated that one of her strengths is giving children structure. She has clear expectations for behavior. She does not allow any bullying. If she notices concerning behavior, she steps in right away to stop it.

She also said that the children become “like family” while they are in her care. She shared that they have fun together and that she enjoys working with them.

3. Identify The Aspects That Fall Below The Standard

110.8 (4) b : Procedures are in place for: Evacuation to safely leave the facility, Relocation to a common, safe location after evacuation, Shelter-in-place to take immediate shelter where the child is when it is unsafe to leave that location due to the emergent issue, Lock down to protect children and providers from an external situation, Communication and reunification with families, Continuity of operations, and Procedures to address the needs of individual children, including those with functional or access needs.
