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Summary of Complaint:

It was reported that Sharesa told a family that there was an overlap and she had to move the children to 3rd shift for billing as it would put her over numbers if she billed them for the correct hours. It was then shown that Sharesa was billing the family overnight care when the family had no need for overnight care.
In running overcapacity reports billing period 7/7/25-7/20/25 for days 7/10/25-7/11/25-showed Sharesa to have 13 kids in care at one time. Sharesa currently has 34 children attached as a CAT B.

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Rule Basis and Findings of Complaint(s):

Code of Iowa Chapter 237A

441 Iowa Administrative Code Chapter 110

441 IAC 110.6 No more children are in care than the number authorized on the registration certificate.

441 IAC 110.14(1)a. Not more than eight preschool children present at any one time including infants. b. Of these 8 children, not more than 4 children who are 24 months of age or younger are present at any one time. c. Not more than four additional school age children. e. When more than 8 children are present for more than two hours, a HHS-approved assistant at least 14 years old is present, unless extra children are present as a result of an emergency school closing.

This worker completed an unannounced visit on the Sharesa Woods child development home on 8/25/25. Sharesa was present with six children in care aged 1 year, 7 months, 2 years, 2 years, 9 months, 4 years, and 5 years. Sharesa reported that she has a total of six children in care during her second shift. Sharesa reported that she currently does not have any children during third shift hours.

Discussed the presenting complaint with Sharesa. Sharesa denied telling a parent that she needed to bill a different schedule because she was full on the other shifts. There is billing evidence to support that Sharesa did bill these children for third shift care and she denies having children on third shift. We also discussed that Sharesa had 13 children in care during the billing period of 7/7/25-7/20/25. Sharesa believes this was a billing error then on her part because she states she is diligent about her numbers. Sharesa shared text messages to several parents where she contacted them stating they could not come on given days because she would be over capacity. Advised Sharesa to contact the CCA Unit to discuss her errors in billing and see how to proceed. Sharesa stated she would do that and would pay those received monies back.

Notes in the KinderTrack system show that Sharesa did call the CCA Unit in Des Moines on 8/26/2025 and reported that she erroneously billed for a child for a few days in July and wanted to repay the monies received. The notes indicate that this totaled \$133.04.

Findings:

There is information to support the concern that Sharesa billed for more children than her allowed capacity. This is confirmed by her own billing reports.

There is information to support the concern that Sharesa billed for children for third shift even though she indicated she did not have third shift care children.

Resolution and Action Required:

This worker contacted the CCA Unit on 8/25/25 to notify them that Sharesa denied having third shift care children. Sharesa contacted the CCA Unit on 8/26/25 notifying them of her errors in billing and asking to repay the monies received for that child.

A full compliance visit was completed prior. Sharesa is still working on parent updates for child files.
