1. Basic Overview

KinderCare Learning Companies, Inc. was founded in 1969 and has grown to become one of the largest providers of childcare in the United States. KinderCare Learning Companies, Inc. is currently primarily owned by Partners Group a Swiss private equity firm as well as other shareholders and investors. KCE Champions LLC is a division of KinderCare Learning Companies, Inc. and included as a core brand along with KinderCare Learning Centers and The Creme School. Specifically, this license and inspection report pertains to KCE Champions LLC @ Hiawatha Elementary School which commenced operations in fall of 2022. This location includes childcare for school-age children outside of school hours including the option to provide full days of childcare on no school days and extended school breaks including winter, spring and summer breaks.

Multi-site regional manager Setara Sous has a BA in criminology, has experience working with children and continues to participate in child development related training. Ms. Sous has also been director qualified since January 2024. Multi-site director Bethany "Bree" Hogue has been with the program since operations commenced in 2022. Ms. Hogue reports working towards completion of an AA degree in early childhood education, has experience working with children and continues to participate in child development related training. On-site supervisor (OSS) Taylor Griffith has been an OSS role since September 2025. Ms. Griffith has experience working with children and continues to participate in child development related training.

On 1/2/2026, program space was observed. Primary programming occurs in the school cafeteria. On some days and hours of operation, the program also has access to the school gymnasium and outdoor school play areas. Sufficient restrooms including hand washing sinks are available. All foods offered to the childcare children are stored and prepared by the Cedar Rapids Community School District in the on-site school kitchen. On 1/2/2026, activities observed included afternoon snack



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and self-selected play. Curriculum on the day of the monitoring visit allowed for a variety of experiences that were observed to pique child interest as well as encourage social emotional growth, innovation, good sportsmanship, the use of social graces and child choice. On 1/2/2026, staff were observed to be in ratio and engaged in programming with the children. Routine transitions were observed to go well. Children appeared comfortable with staff and to be enjoying the day.

### 2. Identify Observed Strengths of the program

According to the family and employee handbook, the philosophy of KCE Champions LCC is that "...learning is meant to be a natural, joyful experience. Our goal is to help your child develop socially, emotionally, physically, and intellectually. Children thrive when the process of discovery is lovingly encouraged and gently reinforced..."

KCE Champions LLC @ Hiawatha Elementary School has established the following website for families and the community to learn more about the program: <https://crschools.us/students-and-families/quick-links/champions/>.

As of 1/2/2026, KCE Champions LLC programs remain for profit and operate under a board of directors having several Chief Operators including ones specific to operations, finance, curriculum and branding. The local management team (e.g. regional manager Setara Sous, multi-site director Ms. Hogue, OSS Ms. Griffith) remains primarily consistent. Management is knowledgeable of licensing guidelines as well as their own policies and procedures. Management has reported holding regular staff meetings to review rules, policies and procedures.

On 1/2/2026, KCE Champions LLC @ Hiawatha Elementary School was found to be maintaining some required posting, maintaining parent-staff-program information centers, utilizing technological communication resources, and offering family programming activities. Curriculum continues to focus on six content areas that research shows enhance children's growth and development as well as help build the essential skills needed to be successful in school and beyond: Character Development, Community, Creative Expression, Executive Function, Inquiry-Based Learning, and Literacy. The program provides child interest areas in creative arts, literacy, math and construction, puzzles and games, and science. Daily fitness, healthy eating, and homework assistance (as needed) are part of the program's operations. Extended school break curriculum continues to be enhanced with guest speaker events and off-site field trips.

KCE Champions LLC continues to have and update as needed policies and procedures that include those for safety, daily health checks, hand washing, cleaning, sanitizing and disinfecting. On 1/2/2026, Ms. Griffith acknowledged how their team of staff continue to help ensure the children's space is sanitary and hazard free each day by following their policies and procedures. Ms. Griffith also talked about having support from the school (e.g. school kitchen staff, school administration, school maintenance, school custodial team) as to daily building and grounds conditions and repairs. School kitchen is inspected by the local health department. There is an AED on-site.

KCE Champions LLC locations including this specific location have emergency plans, policies, and procedures in place which are annually reviewed and updated as needed. The programs have successfully navigated through air quality alerts (2023, 2025), repeated expansion and acquisition events, and repeated technology outages (7/19/24 global technology outage, 10/10/2025 AWS outage, 10/29/2025 Microsoft outage).

### 3. Identify the aspects that fall below the standard

#### 4. Any corrective action plans, provisional license, and safety plans-steps to get into compliance

109.6(4)d Center repeats national criminal history checks at a minimum of every four years or when aware of additional history that occurs.

- Staff file (SK) reviewed lacked documentation of national criminal record check results.
- Staff file (TG) reviewed lacked all documentation. Staff reported transferring from one Champions location to this Hiawatha location on 12/17/2025. Staff indicated file was still at the previous location.

109.10(13)b Emergency instructions, phone numbers, and diagrams for fire, tornado, and flood shall be visibly posted and documented at least once a month for fire and tornado. Records shall be maintained for current and previous year.

- Documentation of a monthly fire drill was not found since August 2025.
- Documentation of a monthly tornado drill was not found since August 2025.



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109.11(4)b Record of monthly inspections of outdoor recreation area and equipment shall be kept.

- Documentation of a monthly outdoor play area inspection was not found for any months in 2024 or 2025.

109.11(3)a Center shall ensure that: Facility and premises are sanitary, safe, and hazard free. Sufficient lighting shall be provided. Sufficient ventilation. Sufficient heating. Sufficient cooling. Equipment placed in the program area is maintained so as not to result in injury to the children.

- A bottle of prescription, non-rescue medication was observed to be in an unlocked cabinet that had no keys and was not able to be locked.

- The program shall have a cleaner, sanitizer and disinfectant available and stored in an inaccessible but readily available manner. Each chemical shall be properly labeled with the name of the contents and manufacturer's instructions of use (e.g. ratio if applicable, dwell time).

**5. Special Notes/Recommendations**

Continue to collaborate with the school district regarding maintenance of the outdoor playground (e.g. adequate cushion surface depth, chipping/rusting equipment, power washing of outdoor equipment). If areas of the outdoor playground become unsatisfactory, the childcare shall refrain from accessing those areas until remedies are made.

Since the childcare uses shared space in a public-school building, ensure there is a locked medication box that is fully functional with keys. All non-rescue medication shall always be locked as well as all rescue medication when the child prescribed the medication is not in attendance. When the child prescribed rescue medication is in attendance, the rescue medication shall be stored in an inaccessible but readily available manner. Also, at least one childcare cabinet shall have a fully functional lock with keys for staff to store chemicals, confidential administrative items (e.g. child files, staff files) and any potential personal items (e.g. purse).

Ensure all required postings are posted in an area frequented by parents each day the site is in operation (e.g. lesson plans with current dates, daily schedule, license, consultant posting, menus, mandatory reporting procedures). The lack of required postings and/or updated posting have been noted in prior annual inspections. As a result, further such findings will be noted as a violation in future reports.

Ensure the childcare entrance (e.g. doorbell, signage) is clearly visible to drop-off and pick-up persons including on days when full childcare is offered.
