II. IDENTIFY THE AREAS OBSERVED ON THE VISIT:

An unannounced visit was completed on 12/17/2019. All programming space was observed.

The center's approved fire inspection was completed on 7/22/19.

The directors are Sarah Baetsle & Rachel Volk. Sarah has a Associates in Early Childhood Education. She started at the center 8/16. Rachel started with the center in 8/16.

The onsite supervisor is Katie Cilek. She has been with the center since 1/2017.

The center provides child care for approximately 161 children.

The center is located inside of a commercial building.

III. IDENTIFY THE OBSERVED STRENGTHS OF THE CENTER:

- -The center utilizes Tadpoles for parent communication.
- -The center directors and onsite supervisor have done a great job of learning the rules and regulations.
- -The teachers were actively engaged with the children. A wide variety of age appropriate materials were available for the children to use.
- -The center is clean and welcoming to those who enter.
- -The center offers doughnuts with dad, muffins with mom, a Halloween parade, a Christmas Program, Preschool Pictures and an open house for the preschool program.

IV. IDENTIFY THE ASPECTS OF OPERATION THAT FALL BELOW THE STANDARDS REVIEWED:

109.10(3)c: For ongoing, long term medications, authorization shall be obtained for a period not to exceed the duration of prescription.

-Expired medications must be returned to the parents for appropriate disposal.

109.11(3)a: Center shall ensure that: Facility and premises are sanitary, safe, and hazard free.

- -Ensure the clothes pens utilized in the classrooms for children under the age of three are not choking hazards.
- -Develop a plan to ensure running water is sufficient for each sink. The spouts currently provided are not allowing sufficient water flow.

V. SPECIAL NOTES/RECOMMENDATIONS:

Based upon this review, it is recommended that this center remain in Full licensing status. The center is directed to correct

the items listed in Section IV. The director gave me a verbal commitment that the noted rule violations would be promptly corrected. It is important to note, all DHS licensing standards and procedures must be maintained during the renewal period.
