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Summary of Complaint:

Concerns reported on 10/8/25 that Beverly was billing up to 11 CCA kids at a time as a category A home with no approved assistants, resulting in over number concerns.

Additional concerns reported on 10/15/25 that kids were coming home with bug bites, unknown if it was fleas, bed bugs, etc... This concern added to original concern above.

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Rule Basis and Findings of Complaint(s):

Code of Iowa Chapter 237A
441 Iowa Administrative Code Chapter 110

441 IAC 110.6 No more children are in care than the number authorized on the registration certificate.
441 IAC 110.13(1)a. Not more than six preschool children present at any one time including infants. b. Of these 6 children, not more than 4 children who are 24 months of age or younger are present at any one time. Of the 4 children 24 months of age or younger, no more than 3 may be 12 months of age or younger. c. Not more than two additional school age children. d. Not more than eight children present when emergency school closing exception is in effect.

441 IAC 110.8 Conditions in the home shall be safe, sanitary and free from hazards.

This worker completed an unannounced visit on 10/14/25 to address the initial concern of over numbers that was reported to the Department. Beverly had four children in attendance on this date. Beverly stated that she believes that there may have possibly been an overlap in billing that caused the concern of having more children than her certificate allows. Beverly stated that approximately 10 days ago she had a conversation with one parent who has four children in care that she can't bring the children during the day due to number concerns and not having room for their children. Beverly stated she this concern has been rectified and will not occur again.

An additional concern was reported on 10/15/2025. Supervisor Aunspach agreed to add this concern of children receiving bug bites to the current open concern rather than opening a new complaint. This worker spoke with Beverly on 10/16/2025 on the telephone. Beverly stated that she did have a mother come and talk to her about concerns her children were receiving bug bites. The children's grandmother believed that the bites were flea bites from petting Beverly's dog. Beverly brought the dog to the veterinarian following this discussion. The vet did not see fleas on the dog, but did send Beverly with pills to treat it just in case. Beverly is still not certain where the bites were coming from as they do spend a lot of time outside and it could have been chiggers or something found outside. Beverly noted that none of Beverly's own children or any other day care children reported having any bug bites. Beverly stated that the grandmother of the children who received the bites also has pets, so it is possible that the concerns came from there.

Findings:

There is a preponderance of evidence to support the concern that Beverly billed for more children than allowed by her registration certificate. Beverly herself submitted these billings. Beverly does not have an approved assistant and regardless would have been over numbers with or without an assistant present.

There is not a preponderance of evidence to support the concern that the children received bug bites directly from Beverly's environment. No other children reported these concerns or had bites.

Resolution and Action Required:

Beverly took the dog to the veterinarian and received pills just in case fleas were present.
Beverly spoke to a family with four children in care and stated that they could no longer attend due to concerns with number of children in care.
