She continues using the main floor only of her 2 story home. Jayne has a main floor furnace and has her water heater in a cellar below the home that has a trap door access only. She had no children present during the time of our visit. Jayne is currently caring for 5 part time children. She has one dog who is needing a current vet statement to have on file. Jayne needs some current work on some of her files and she is receptive to working with Katie Cruise from Child Care Resource and Referral on this project. Jayne uses her deck, driveway, and a side yard as her outside play area. She is due to renew her registration effective 3/31/2027.

2. Identify Observed Strengths Of The Program

Jayne maintains low numbers of children allowing her to provide good attention to the kids. She describes her strengths as the relationship she forms with the children and parents. Several of the children Jayne cares for are school age. These children have regular homework time when they arrive after school. They also have outside time and sometimes walk to the library as a group. She offers regular arts and crafts to all of the children. Jayne participates in the Food Program to enhance the nutrition of her meals and snacks.

3. Identify The Aspects That Fall Below The Standard

All dogs and cats have annual examinations. Records of the exams are on file and must verify that routine immunizations are current and animal is free of endo and ecto parasites.

Form 470-5153, Pet Health Examination Veterinary Health Certificate, is on file.

- Jayne needs to obtain a current vet statement for her dog to have on file. This needs to be completed using the State form she has a copy of and needs to be renewed every year.

- Jayne needs to find/obtain her current certification in the Mandatory Reporter training to have on file.

For school aged children: An annual statement of health condition signed by the parent or legal guardian, annually from date of statement of health or admission physical.

110.9 (4) f : For each school-age child, record of a physical exam completed at the time of school enrollment or since.

110.9 (4) g : A signed and dated immunization certificate provided by the state Department of Public Health.

110.9 (4) i : Documentation signed by the parent which names persons authorized to pick up the child, their telephone number, and relationship to the child.

110.9 (4) j : Written permission from the parent(s) for their child to attend activities away from the child development home.

- Jayne needs to assemble an entire file for one of the children in care that contains the items listed in the description above. She also needs to update physicals in a couple of her other files.

The above corrections need to be in place by 7/3/2026 and will be reviewed during her next visit.
