I conducted a compliance visit with Registered Child Development Home Category B provider Emily Klenk on 1/26/2026. Emily has been involved in child care for 12 years. She is currently using the basement level only of her 2 story home. Emily has a full length egress window that extends all the way to the floor, no step system required. Emily had 5 children in care during the time of our visit, and has 6 total children in care at this time. She has no current HHS-approved substitutes or assistants at this time. Emily has a fenced in back yard that she uses for her outside play area. She currently has 6 cats; all have current vet statements on file, and the cats really don't have access to the child care space. Emily is due to renew her registration effective 9/30/2027.

Emily is currently working on becoming IQ4K Level 1 certified. She has regular interaction with her CCR&R worker. Emily describes her strengths as being dependable, caring, organized, and flexible with parents schedules. Emily displayed good multi-tasking skills during the time of our visit. Emily describes her curriculum as educational and age appropriate. The children have lots of exposure to colors, shapes, coloring, arts, and various other structured activities that she works in. Emily participates in the Food Program to enhance the nutrition of her meals and snacks.
