CHILD CARE ANNUAL EVALUATION

1. Basic Overview

Kris Weaver has been providing childcare services for 30 years. She has eight children in care on this date. The children were playing with toys when compliance staff arrived. The childcare takes up the majority of the home for play and napping. The home has all necessary signage and emergency routes posted for safety. The provider reported that she is not involved with the food program, but she follows the food program guidelines and offers meals and snacks to the children during their time in care.

2. Identify Observed Strengths Of The Program

The provider stated her strengths include that she maintains daily structure for the children in her care. She believes that outside play is important for the children and she will get them out to play as much as possible with favorable weather.

Compliance staff was able to observe the provider with the children in her care. They easily approached the provider with questions or needs. The provider speaks calmly with the children and uses redirection to end an issue between children. The provider reported that there are times that a time out is used with children when redirection and basic instructions are not followed.

The provider was in full compliance with regulation standards.

2026 targeted compliance measure: Emergency Preparedness Plan.
