Rule Basis and Findings of Complaint(s):

Code of Iowa, Chapter 237A

441 Iowa Administrative Code Chapter 110

441 IAC 110.8(6)a. Discipline. Corporal punishment including spanking, shaking, and slapping is not used. b. No punishment is used which is humiliating or frightening, or causes pain or discomfort to the child. e. Discipline is designed to help the child develop self-control, self-esteem, and respect for the rights of others.

441 IAC 110.8 Conditions in the home shall be safe, sanitary and free from hazards.

441 IAC 110.7(1)e. Shall be free of the use of illegal drugs and shall not be under the influence of alcohol or of any prescription or non-prescription drug that could impair their ability to give careful supervision.

HHS workers Huinker and Blair met with Sharesa at her home on 12/30/2025. HHS Huinker spoke with Sharesa and Sharesa denied using any physical discipline in her child care. Sharesa has generally used redirection, separating kids, and time outs as needed. Sharesa reported that she treats day care children like her own and always places safety first within her child care. Sharesa provided several parents' contact information for this worker to contact as references. One parent stated that Sharesa continues to accommodate her through some challenging times. This parent stated that they have a difficult time trusting people with their children, but have never had any issues with Sharesa. This parent stated that since she has a "wild child", she is aware of Sharesa's discipline techniques which typically include loss of privileges, having them sit down for a while, and communicating behavioral concerns directly to the parents. This parent stated that she has stopped by unannounced and at unexpected times and have never seen any concerns. This parent stated that Sharesa communicates well with the families. Another parent spoke about Sharesa being very respectful as are her children. One parent contacted spoke about Sharesa having a definite schedule or routine in place, providing the kids with consistency. Sharesa has individual cups and bottles for all children so the parents do not need to remember to bring those daily. Sharesa reportedly communicates well with parents, letting them know about even minor injuries. This parent stated that she didn't think Sharesa really ever has to discipline kids because for the most part, they listen to her.

Sharesa informed HHS workers Huinker and Blair that a household member has admitted to using illegal substances in the home environment. Sharesa reported this individual has since been removed from the home and resides elsewhere. Sharesa denied the use of illegal substances herself. Sharesa was agreeable with all of HHS workers' recommendations and it was determined she was compliant with this child care regulation.

Findings:

There is not information to support the concern that Sharesa utilizes physical discipline on children in care.

There is information that illegal substances were being used in the home. Sharesa admitted a household member used illegal substances. This individual has since been removed from the home by Sharesa.

Resolution and Action Required:

A safety plan was completed with Sharesa on 12/30/2025 that stated that Sharesa will not have illegal substances in the home. Further stated that Sharesa and all household members, approved assistants, and substitutes will be free of the use of illegal drugs and shall not be under the influence of alcohol or of any prescription or non-prescription drug that could impair their ability to provide careful supervision. Sharesa had a household member leave the home due to admitted use of illegal substances.

Random unannounced visits by HHS will occur to ensure the safety plan continues to be followed.
